Patriot John Abney Wreath Annual Laying December 19, 2023

SAR Galvez Chapter and DAR Chapters Dorcheat –Bistineau, Pelican and Shreveport jointly sponsored a wreath laying ceremony to pay respect and honor to Revolutionary SAR Patriot John Abney on December 19, 2023. The wreath laying was held at the Camp Zion Cemetery, Haughton. Louisiana.

There were a total of eleven SAR and DAR members present. The invocation was provided by Dorcheat-Bistineau Regent Cindy Madden. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all. Regent Paula Roper of the Pelican Chapter made comments honoring Patriot John Abney for his contribution to our freedom and democracy today. Following Regent Roper's comments, the SAR and DAR wreaths were presented.

Patriot John Abney, buried in the Camp Zion Cemetery, Haughton, LA, was born in 1765 in Edgefield County, South Carolina. He joined the Upper 96th District Regiment of the South Carolina Militia in 1781 when he was 16 years old. As a soldier he participated in the “**The Siege of Ninety-Six**” and several other battles and skirmishes. He married after the war and stayed in South Carolina until after 1830. He moved from South Carolina to Alabama then to Bossier Parish just before 1847. John Abney lived in Bossier Parish just a short time before he died in 1847. He provides one of Louisiana’s many links to the Revolutionary War.

The Siege of Ninety-Six - The British had secured Ninety-Six as a base of operations in the backcountry in June of 1780, and Lt. General Charles, Lord Cornwallis believed Ninety-Six would be crucial to control of the backcountry once the British Army moved northward out of South Carolina.

Major General Nathanael Greene set siege to Ninety-Six in May of 1781, but never took the fort. He was forced to lift the siege a month later as British reinforcements advanced toward Ninety-Six. The British abandoned Ninety-Six in July and moved back to the coast, just as the Patriots wanted. This signaled the end of British control of the interior. The Southern Campaign was essentially over. British forces surrendered at Yorktown four months later, effectively ending the war.

In January, Compatriot Leonard Rohrbough attended the interment of a WWII sailor from the USS Oklahoma who was killed when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. The sailor was interned at the Southeast Louisiana Veterans Cemetery in Slidell, LA

The unknown sailor was unidentified and buried on Diamond Head until 2019 when DNA samples were taken. The identification bureau located a match with a grand nephew in New Orleans. This is the second interment from the USS Oklahoma within two years.
